
The SPCA Serving Allegany County





When I look back at 2024 we had so much to celebrate. Last year on June 1st it was our Five Year Anniversary of being at our new shelter located in Belmont, hard to believe it has been 5 years already!! Who would have thought so many of our hopes and our dreams came true during those five years. It most definitely wasn't easy going from a very small shelter of 1300 square feet to a new building of 15,000 square feet, quite frankly it was a culture shock, but I am happy to say we have adjusted guite well...and over the past 5 yrs we have evolved! We were met with many challenges over the past five years as to the overwhelming number of animals needing our help, the increase in visitors & phone calls, increase in our community outreach, the ups and downs with adoptions and the huge need for spay & neuter services. We have helped so many more animals than what we were capable of doing before with the additional space, and being able to properly house animals in our care and to give them a healthier & low stress environment to reside in. Over the past 5 years we have taken in close to 4,000 animals and have adopted out 3,775 animals, we are saving more lives than ever before and making a huge difference. Our spay neuter clinic has

had a great impact on our community, we have spayed & neutered 8,500 cats & dogs... and even some pot-bellied pigs. To celebrate our 5 Year Anniversary on June 1st – we held a family friendly event with kids activities, a bounce house, face painting, dog training demonstrations, vendors, food, T-shirt design contest and great music by Casual Remix, who were also the group who were playing at our grand opening 5 years ago.

In October of 2024 it was the SPCA's 30th anniversary of our largest fundraiser the Theme Basket Auction. Many moons ago when we first started we had less than 20 baskets up for auction and that was our major fundraiser, now we have over 400 baskets that are donated each and every year and thousands of people pass through our doors in order to participate and help support the SPCA. We thank everyone who has helped to contribute donations year after year and for all of those who volunteer many hours to help make it a success.

Finally, after a very tough 2 years dealing with so many cruelty cases, the increased costs in medical care and slower adoptions,

we received the most delightful and utterly unexpected news – in fact, it was downright amazing! The Golisano Foundation - Bailey and Friends had gifted 360 million to 82 nonprofit organizations in Western New York. We received the news in September that we were a recipient of a jaw-dropping \$1.5 million, that will be disbursed to us over the next 4 years! We couldn't contain our excitement - and we're pretty sure even our shelter cats and dogs got goosebumps right along with us! Since 1911, we've been on a mission to help animals in our community, and this generous gift will allow us to keep making a difference in the lives of even more furry friends and to be able to offer more services to help animals in our county. Paws up and a huge thank you to the Tom Golisano Foundation - Bailey & Friends and an extra wag of appreciation to Tom and Monica who true animal lovers at heart!

Seventeen years old and waiting. That's the story Butch, a senior Shiba Inu, as he spent an entire year at the SPCA shelter. Day after day, visitors passed him by. The young, sprightly pups captured attention, but Butch—a little slower, with a graying muzzle and creaky joints—was overlooked.

For many, the idea of adopting an elderly dog seemed daunting. Concerns about vet bills, limited time, and the heartbreak of saying goodbye too soon kept Butch waiting. It was a lonely year, and with every passing day, the hope of finding his forever home seemed to fade.

But everything changed last December when Rhonda walked through the SPCA doors. Recently widowed and grappling with her own loneliness. As part of his golden years, Rocky is eating the best of the best. Rhonda enjoys sharing her meals with him, offering him tender turkey, savory beef, or juicy chicken from her plate. "He's earned it," Rhonda says with a smile. "Every meal feels like a little celebration." IT'S NEVER TOO LATE TO DONATE!

Did you know that the SPCA Serving Allegany County is a non-profit 501c3 tax-exempt charity and we do NOT receive any governmental funding? Our SPCA solely exists due to donations, fundraisers, grants and bequests. SO why not let the SPCA help you save big money this tax season? Donations made to the SPCA are tax deductible and a great way to help the residents and animals of our country. Indeed, there are several advantages to giving the charity including, creating good will, the feeling you get knowing you have made a difference in your community and the personal tax benefits knowing that Uncle Sam is getting just a little bit less from your pocket. Although our friends at the IRS keep a watchful eye on charitable deductions, if you donate to an IRS approved tax-exempt entity such as ours, and keep track of your paperwork, it makes the tax season much easier for you and your tax preparation professional. Also, our charity is useful in estate planning as well. We accept donations of stocks, securities, annuities, life insurance, collectables and pledges. Donations can

Will my donation stay in Allegany County? ABSOLUTELY, all of the donations to the SPCA Serving Allegany County remain here. Although we are the only SPCA in our county, we are not affiliated with county government at all. We receive no governmental stipends or financial support in any manner and your donations are greatly appreciated as we are totally privately funded by animal loving people just like you.

How much can I donate? Typically, as much as you want! However, please consult your tax professional as certain types of donations can have other implications on your taxes. That being said, there are typically no limits on monetary charitable donations for most tax payers.

What documentation must I keep if I donate to the SPCA Serving Allegany County? For monetary donations above \$250 you must keep a written confirmation from the SPCA that has our name, the date and the amount you gave on it. We are only required to provide these for donations over \$250 and we do just that. If you are giving less than \$250, generally a cancelled check, credit card receipt/ statement or bank record is sufficient to satisfy the IRS.
